2022 OUTSTANDING CIVIL ENGINEERING ACHIEVEMENT AWARD WINNERS

The American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) Hawaii Section is pleased to announce the 2022 Outstanding Civil Engineering Achievement (OCEA) Award winners. The purpose of this award program is to recognize projects that demonstrate important outstanding civil engineering accomplishments by Hawaii's design and construction professionals. To be eligible, projects were required to have been designed or constructed in Hawaii and completed within the last two years. Some of the key judging criteria included: Resourcefulness in planning and solving design challenges; contributions to the well-being of people and communities; pioneering use of materials and methods; Innovations in construction; minimization of impact on physical environment; and composite application.

The following projects and project teams were honored and presented with awards at the ASCE Hawaii Section OCEA Awards Ceremony, which was held on Friday, September 30 at the Kahala Hotel and Resort. Congratulations to our winners!

2022 Hawaii Section Outstanding Civil Engineering Achievement Award and 2022 Best Building/Structural Project Project Name: Hale Kalele Project Owner: Kobayashi Group

Submitted By: BASE

Hale Kalele is a mixed-use development featuring a 20-story affordable rental tower, a two-story Juvenile Center, and six-level parking structure. This project was a publicprivate partnership with developer Kobayashi Group and an unprecedented crossagency enterprise between the Hawaii State Judiciary and the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation (HHFDC) to transform a State-owned, underutilized urban parcel, into a 200-unit affordable rental tower along with a new and upgraded Juvenile Center. Kobayashi Group expended extra time and energy to be mindful of the carbon footprint of the project and worked with the design and



construction team to develop a strategy to reduce the embodied carbon of the project. This included incorporating CarbonCure into the vertical construction. CarbonCure uses clean technology to create concrete with less cement, resulting in a reduced carbon footprint without comprising strength.

2022 Best Large Project

Project Name: Awa Street Wastewater Pump Station Force Main and Sewer System Improvements

Project Owner: City and County of Honolulu Dept. of Environmental Services

Submitted By: Okahara and Associates, Inc.

This project originally intended to address a consent decree project to upgrade the Awa Street WWPS by expanding its capacity. Showing the resourcefulness of the project team during the planning phase it was identified that redirecting wastewater flow by constructing a new trunk sewer along Waiakamilo Road, from North School Street to Nimitz Highway, would address three separate consent decree projects. Some notable aspects of this project were the innovation in construction materials and methods to deal with a challenging construction location and concerns of contaminated media in the area.



2022 Best Medium Project Project Name: Sand Island Wastewater Treatment Plant Outfall Shore Protection Project Owner: City and County of Honolulu Dept. of Environmental Services

Submitted By: Sea Engineering. Inc.

This project involved the design of shore protection for the coastal reach on Sand Island where the outfall critical infrastructure is potentially at risk. Some of the challenges included addressing erosion from nearly all sides, which resulted in a hook-shaped rubble mound structure that straddled the outfall pipe corridor. Other notable aspects of this project included designing for sea level rise, pressure limitations on the pipe, and the need for constant communication between engineers and the contractor during construction and placement of the toe stones.



2022 Best Small Project Project Name: Waimea Wastewater Treatment Plant R-1 Process Optimization Project Owner: County of Kauai Wastewater

Management Division

Submitted By: Kennedy Jenks

In 2021 the County of Kaua'i completed a rigorous project focused on improving the wastewater effluent quality at Waimea WWTP to generate R-1 recycled water for irrigation purposes, with a minimal \$30,000 capital investment. By leveraging the collective team's understanding of the WWTP, project goals were met by achieving Hawai'i's regulatory requirements for R-1 recycled water. Expensive infrastructure construction was avoided by making simple adjustments to treatment processes driven by wastewater testing data. The project will result in the preservation of groundwater for potable use, as well as the reduction of injection wells used for wastewater effluent disposal.






2022 PE Exam Update



2022 Best Water/Wastewater/Environmental Project

Project Name: SY-001 Wastewater Pump Station at Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam

Project Owner: NAVFAC Hawaii

Submitted By: NAVFAC Hawaii

The SY-001 WWPS located in the Pearl Harbor Naval Shipyard has a peak pumping capacity of 24 million gallons per day and is the Navy's most critical WWPS in Hawaii. The original SY-001 WWPS constructed in 1971 has experienced accelerated deterioration due to harsh environmental operating conditions which include highly corrosive sewer gases generated by saline septic sewage from ported ships and sea water infiltrating into the aging sewers. The new \$67.1 million three-story pump station, constructed in 2.3 years under Military Construction Project P-704 in 2021, employs four 385-horsepower variable-speed pumps, each with a rated capacity of 8.0 mgd.



2022 Best Special Project Project Name: Ala Moana Wastewater Pump Station Upgrade

Project Owner: City and County of Honolulu Dept. of Environmental Services

The AMWWPS facility is the largest WWPS operated by the City and County of Honolulu, conveying over 45 mgd from the urban core of Honolulu to the Sand Island WWTP. This rehabilitation project increased reliability, redundancy, and flexibility at the City's most important pump station, protecting public health and safety by reducing risk of a wastewater spill in the heart of Honolulu. In addition to schedule challenges, construction sequencing required careful coordination with City operations to ensure the facility was not at risk or disrupting normal City operations. The AMWWPS facility had to remain operational and be capable of conveying storm flows at all times throughout construction.



2022 Best International Project Project Name: Wave One Project Owner: Wave Infratech Submitted By: BASE

Wave One is a \$276 million, 41-story mixeduse building with more than 2 million square feet of floor area located in the heart of Noida, India. BASE was an integral part of a designassist team that had several goals for the project: Advanced concrete finishing methods to reduce total concrete consumption; utilize post-tensioned flat slab systems for both material optimization and speed; find creative, yet practical ways to address multiple transfer girders needed for the varying requirements of this mixed-use project; and create an enhanced safety program for the project which included complicated shoring requirements for the large transfer girders.



2022 Best Humanitarian Project

Project Name: Koko Crater Stairs Rehabilitation Project Owner: City and County of Honolulu Dept. of Parks and Recreation

Submitted By: Kokonut Koalition

The project was part of a public-private partnership between the City and County of Honolulu and the Kokonut Koalition. Decades of neglect and accelerating wear and tear by hikers were leading to severe decay and erosion, making the Koko Crater Stairs increasingly hazardous. Enginuity Engineering and the Kokonut Koalition based their design on an innovative application of overhead rail clips typically used for cranes. This project's effort is remarkable for the fact that they relied entirely on simple hand and battery-powered tools using unskilled volunteer labor to rebuild 1200-feet of stairs.



2022 Best Green/Sustainable/Envision Project

Project Name: 806 Iwilei Affordable Housing and Resource Center

Project Owner: City and County of Honolulu Dept. of Land Management

Submitted By: G70

The project redeveloped one of the warehouse buildings into a single-use tenant building that provides meals to families in need. The other warehouse was demolished and replaced with a new mixed-use building comprised of ground floor retail spaces and affordable housing. The existing freestanding carport roof was removed and replaced in kind. In addition to addressing the need for

transitional housing, this project demonstrates that green stormwater infrastructure can be implemented in site-challenged developments and the landscape plants can be selected with low maintenance in mind. The selection of native ground cover, shrubs, and trees allows for the biofilters to treat runoff and sustain plant life.




